



Thanks for downloading the Place Value Christmas Tree Activity from Galloping Games LLC!

Notes about the activity: For frequent use and durability, print the activity onto cardstock and laminate. Use a dry-erase marker over the lamination. If you don't have a laminator, use a plastic sheet protector and a dry-erase marker.

Teaching Tip: Emphasize that the biggest value takes the largest triangle spot on the Christmas tree. This helps children visualize the size of numbers in comparison to other numbers.

Example Tree:




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Place Value Christmas Trees



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Directions: Separate the hundreds, tens, and ones cards into three piles. Draw a card from the hundreds pile and write that number in the biggest triangle of one Christmas tree. Repeat for the tens and write it in the middle triangle. Draw a card from the ones pile and write it in the top triangle of the tree. Then, write the sum of the three numbers in the tree trunk. Repeat with all six trees.
For thousands place: Add in the thousands cards. Use the star as the ones place.
